

Choosing Wisely Australia is part of a global initiative enabling clinicians, consumers and healthcare stakeholders to start important conversations about tests, treatments and procedures where evidence shows they provide no benefit and, in some cases, lead to harm. The initiative is led by Australia's medical colleges and societies and is facilitated by NPS MedicineWise.

Health services are leading the implementation of Choosing Wisely Australia through clinician-led initiatives and playing a key role in delivering quality evidence-based care for the benefit of all Australians.

Our objectives



Change clinician and consumer attitudes about unnecessary tests, treatments and procedures.



Engage consumers in conversations about what tests, treatments or procedures are needed and which are unnecessary.



Change clinical practice to reduce unnecessary tests, treatments and procedures.



Align changes in clinical practice within the broader health system and health policy to reduce unnecessary tests, treatments and procedures.





Choosing Wisely in Australia

The initiative was launched in 2015 with just 6 health professional colleges publishing 26 recommendations. It is now a network of 97 health organisations comprising Champion Health Services, specialist colleges and consumer organisations. There are now 207 recommendations and a range of implementation activities to put the recommendations into practice.




